By Statute 6 & 7 Will IV, c. 86, s. 35, it is enacted, "That every Rector, Vicar or Curate and every Registrar, Clerk, Officer, and Secretary, who shall have the keeping for the time being of any Register Book of Births, Deaths, or Marriages shall at all reasonable times allow searches to be made of any Register Book in his keeping and shall give a Copy Certified under his hand of any Entry or Entries in the same on payment of the Fee hereinafter mentioned; (that is to say) for every search extending over a period of not more than One Year, the sum of 1/- additional for every additional Year and the sum of 2/- for every single Certificate," (not including the stamp) 23 Vic. c. 15.

By Statute 24 & 25 Vict., c. 99, sect. 24, a copy of any Book which is of such a Public Nature as to be admissible in evidence on its mere production from the proper custody is made admissible in evidence in any Court of Justice provided it purport to be Signed and Certified as a true Copy by the Officer to whose Custody the Original is intrusted.
