This is the Last Will and Testament
of me William Wridge of Number 36 Dallas Road Wells Road
Lydenham Kent I direct payment of all my just debts and
funeral and testamentary expenses as soon as conveniently it
may be after my decease for which purpose I direct the sum of
ten pounds payable on my decease out of the funds of the Society
called the Loyal United Friends of which I am a member and
shall be first applied I give my writing desk to my friend
Henry Williams the younger of Number 33 Bloth Lane West
Smithfield Lignboard Painter I give and devise my freehold
house Number 19 Prospect Road Lydenham aforesaid to my
wife Frances Wridge for her life and after her decease I give it
the same to my nephew John Wridge I give and devise my
freehold house Number 21 Prospect Road aforesaid to my said
wife for her life and after her decease I give the same to my
nephew Walker Wridge All the rest residue and remainder of
my property estate and effects I give devise and bequeath to my
said wife and William Barrett of Lydenham aforesaid such
ever their heirs executors administrators and assigns according
to the natures and tenures thereof Upon trust that my said wife
shall and may during her life have and use all my furniture
plate plaid goods linen china and household effects and receive
and take the rents proceeds and income of the remainder of
the residuary property estate and effects and after her death
Upon trust that the Trustee or Trustees for the time being of
this my Will shall sell call in and convert into money my
said residuary estate and divide the net proceeds equally
between my nephews William Wridge Thomas Wridge Frederick
Wridge Henry Wridge George Wridge and Richard Wridge and
my nieces Ann Wridge Elizabeth Hewlett and Ellen Wridge or
(daughters of my brother John) Mary Harcourt and Louisa Wridge

Daughters of my brother Richard) and Eliza Widge Emma Widge
and Caroline Widge (daughters of my brother George) or such of my
said nephews and nieces as shall be living at the time of the decease
of my said wife and the issue who may then be living of any or either
of my said nephews and nieces who may be born dead leaving issue
(such issue taking his or their deceased parents share only) And I in
deed that in case the Executors or Trustees for the time being of this my
Will shall not within twelve calendar months after the decease of my
said wife receive satisfactory evidence that all the Beneficiaries under
this my Will are then alive they may proceed to divide my residuary
estate amongst those of the Beneficiaries of whose being then alive
they shall have received such proof I appoint my said wife and the
said William Barrett Executors of this my Will In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand this twentieth day of June one thousand
eight hundred and eighty eight — W. Widge — Signed by the said
Testator as his last Will and Testament in the presence of us present
at the same time who in his presence and in the presence of each
other have subscribed our names as witnesses — Thos. C. Burr rights
Jas. Forest Trade — John A. Eld Wretzig his Clerk.

On the 1st October 1870 Probate of this Will was granted to
Frances Widge Widow out of the Executors.
